Competition

Junior competition is provided at four levels.

1. Beginners Series.

This is open to all juniors with basic skills.

They do not require club membership or an official handicap. This program is based on 5-9 holes of supervised play with the purpose of introducing juniors and parents to golf play and course etiquette.

2. Darwin Rotary Top End Junior Series.(TEJS)

This is a supervised 6, 9 and 18 hole competition program for all juniors with or without a handicap. It is currently sponsored by Darwin Rotary and the program can be located on the Golf NT website - www.golfnt.org.au click on junior development.

3. Club Competition.
